Symphonic Jazz Orchestra Returns to the Concert Stage for the First Time in Three Years in Free Community Concert on Sept 18 at 3 p.m.

Part of the Carpenter Center's Arts For Life: Community Connections program, this free concert features world premieres by composers Jihye Lee and Remy LeBoeuf

LONG BEACH, California — The Carpenter Performing Arts Center, located on the campus of California State University, Long Beach, presents a free community concert on Sunday, September 18 at 3 p.m. The hourlong concert with Symphonic Jazz Orchestra, conducted by Mitch Glickman, marks Symphonic Jazz Orchestra's first return to the concert stage in three years.

The program begins with George Duke's "Festival," followed by two world premieres by composers Jihye Lee and Remy LeBoeuf. Remy will perform as the alto sax soloist in his new work. The concert is a blend of jazz, classical and Brazilian influences that is the trademark of the world-class ensemble. Tickets are free and available online only at carpenterarts.org.
