Damien Sneed and Friends Celebrate Holiday Classics on Sunday, Dec. 12

"Joy to the World: A Christmas Musical Journey" Includes Gospel, Jazz, and Traditional Holiday Favorites

LONG BEACH, California — The Richard and Karen Carpenter Performing Arts Center rings in the holiday season on Sunday, December 12 with "Joy to the World: A Christmas Musical Journey," featuring composer and pianist Damien Sneed and a talented cast of vocalists and musicians. This rousing afternoon concert includes Sneed's original arrangements of "Joy to the World," "Silent Night," "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" and many other gospel, jazz, and traditional holiday favorites. "Joy to the World: A Christmas Musical Journey" is the final stop on Damien Sneed's seven-date "Joy to the World" tour and the first holiday performance on the Carpenter Center's stage since 2019.

"Holiday shows at the Carpenter Center are a cherished tradition," says Executive Director Megan Kline Crockett. "This year, I can't wait for audiences to experience the energy and joy that Damien Sneed brings to this must-see Christmas concert."

"Joy to the World: A Christmas Musical Journey" is Damien Sneed's first tour in nearly two years, and embodies his mission to bring joy, love, and unity to audiences through the power of music.
