Internationally Renowned Dancer-Illusionists Return With Reimagining of Classic Lewis Carroll Tale

LONG BEACH, California — Audience favorite MOMIX returns to the Carpenter Center on the campus of California State University, Long Beach, on Saturday, April 30 at 8 p.m. with *Alice*. Artistic Director Moses Pendleton's newest creation reimagines Lewis Carroll's "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland" in an evening filled with whimsical, dream-like imagery and jaw-dropping choreography.

Conjuring a world of shifting perspectives and astounding visuals as Alice shrinks and grows, the dancerillusionists of *MOMIX* also reacquaint audiences with the White Rabbit, the Mad Hatter, and the Queen of Hearts in this surreal and highly inventive experience. MOMIX's performance at the Carpenter Center is the company's only Southern California stop on their current tour that's just arrived from Paris and resumes in Italy this summer.
